Celebrating Mass together during restrictions

- Every Mass is now a 'Sunday Mass'. The Irish Bishops have suspended the 'obligation' to attend on a Sunday so every Mass now holds as a Sunday Mass. This means that parishioners who are not free and not working could attend the 10am Mass during a weekday instead of a Sunday Mass thereby allowing working parishioners and young families to attend at the weekend.
- May we also ask that those who attend Mass everyday would please limit themselves to attending once a week.
 I know this is an imposition but as with all these requests / guidelines its "For the time being" and not forever.
- Mass will be celebrated at the Main Altar for all Masses except with perhaps the 11am Mass and not in the porch of the Church. This will be subject to review each week. Numbers coming to most Masses are manageable thanks to the "Sign in Sheet" initiative. We are indebted to the very many stewards who are helping us in this regard.
- The "Jubilee doors" facing the Main Altar will be left open during Mass for those who wish to remain outside. Some seating (under a canopy) will be provided along with extra Amplification. Some parishioners feel more comfortable outside the building and we aim to make them as much a part of our worship as everybody else.
- Special "Collection Boxes" have been made for parishioners to leave donations, envelopes or offerings as they enter or leave the Church. This will replace the collection which used to take place in the middle of Mass as baskets/bags can no longer be used as per the Bishops instruction.as

Sign-In Sheets

'Sign-In Sheets' for each Mass in the Church of the Immuaculate Conception—Ashbourne have been provided for some weeks both for the weekday and weekend Masses. Parishioners are now self regulating the one Mass they attend each week.

Important points to remember:

- If you have signed in for a particular Mass please try and keep to that Mass
- 2) If you have signed for a particular Mass you need to show up at least 5 minutes before the Mass begins to be guaranteed a seat
- Donaghmore Church will only have 16 benches available for public use which means that one family from an individual household can occupy one bench. This means that the Sunday 10am Mass at Donaghmore Church will be most restricted of all Masses to attend. For this particular Mass, parishioners will have to book in to the Parish Office to secure a bench. Obviously those who have a Mass intention arranged will be given a priority. Outside amplifications will be switched on for those who wish to stand outside.
- Overflow Issues Whether its Ashbourne or Donaghmore
 Church there will be certain Masses especially at the
 weekend where not everybody will be able to get into
 Church so the outside amplification will be switched on.
 In Ashbourne a Minister of the Eucharist will distribute
 Holy Communion at a specially designed station located
 at the Parish Office door.

- Ministers of the Eucharist will distribute Holy Communion wearing a mask and visor for your and their protection. They will not wear gloves as per the instructions we have been given from Bishop Tom. Holy Communion will only be distributed on the hand and not on the tongue. This is for everybody's protection and we appreciate your understanding in this regard.
- The hour of Communion distribution on a Sunday (3.30-4.30pm) will be <u>discontinued</u> from Sunday 16th August as the number of parishioners turning up is very small. If people are nervous about attending Mass then remaining in your car during Mass and receiving at the Parish Office door during Communion time is a possibility.
- <u>Toilets</u>:- Will only be available in the Parish Hall and not the Parish Office. Toilets will only be available during Mass times
- Please obey the stewards, social distancing and the signage.

Pope Francis has invited young people around the world to perform "gestures of tenderness" toward the elderly, as many are forced into isolation to observe Covid-19 health guidelines.

The Vatican's Dicastery for Laity, Family, and Life quickly answered that call and launched "The elderly are your grandparents" campaign.

In a communiqué released on Monday, the Dicastery invited young people "to do something that shows kindness and affection for older people who may feel lonely."

"The pandemic has hit the elderly particularly hard and it has disconnected the already weak links between generations," reads the statement. "However, respecting social distancing rules does not mean accepting a destiny of loneliness and abandonment."

The Dicastery for Laity, Family, and Life recalled examples of people contacting the elderly by phone and internet, with some even performing serenades to the residents of retirement homes.

"Young people," says the communique, "have been doing this to help alleviate the loneliness being felt by many people who are obliged by the pandemic to stay at home or remain confined in residential care facilities."

Send a hug

Since health regulations remain in place in many countries to protect the elderly, the Dicastery urges young Catholics to send a hug to the older people of their parish or neighborhood who may be experiencing loneliness. They can do so by phone, video call, or by sending an image.

"Wherever possible – or whenever the health emergency will allow it – we invite young people to make the embrace even more concrete by visiting elderly in person."

Young people are encouraged to share their outreach efforts on social media by including #sendyourhug in the post. The best posts will be shared on the social media accounts of the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life @laityfamilylife.
