The 2021 Blessing of Graves in the Parish

The 7pm mass is offered for all those interred in Ashbourne Church cemetery. We especially remember all those interred since the beginning of the pandemic. The 10am Donaghmore mass is offered for all those interred in Donaghmore Church cemetery.

Fr. Michael and Fr. Ciaran will bless the graves in Ashbourne Church cemetery this Saturday evening after the Vigil Mass and will bless the graves in the Donaghmore cemeteries after the Sunday morning eucharistic celebration.

Next Saturday the blessing of the graves will take place in Killelband cemetery and the 9am Sunday mass will be offered for the repose of those interred within the cemetery grounds.

Families with loved ones interred are asked to have their graves ready for the occasion. They are invited to join us at mass physically or online. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic restrictions the gathering of families for the blessing cannot take place in the usual way.

Sale of Parish Land

In July, just as Fr. Michael moved to the parish, the diocesan property committee which act for the St. Finian's Diocesan Trust (of which Ashbourne -Donaghmore parish is a one 69th constituent) wrote to the parish stating that it had sold parish land zoned residential for the benefit of Ashbourne-Donaghmore parish. After paying costs and fees the parish is due to receive €794,954.61. It is proposed by the members of the parish finance committee that the parish use this money to pay off its outstanding debts. Three parish loans totalling €245,575.60 are currently a burden on the future development of our parish. The remaining monies from the sale of the lands will be safeguarded for investment in capital projects needed to further the mission of our parish in the years ahead. Substantial repair works have recently been completed on the roof of the parish office and with increasing seepage and dampness on the roof of the church and walls of parish hall some of this money is already needed. The parish is eternally grateful to the late Ned Nulty for donating the land in Killegland from which these proceeds derive. May he rest in eternal peace.

First Communion in our Parish

Fr. Michael and Fr. Ciaran wrote to the school principals on Friday last detailing the proposed new September times and dates for 1st communion in our parish. These are provisional. The safety measures that our parish expects parents to follow is also outlined. In September before the sacraments take place parents will be asked to decide if they feel it is safe for their child to receive the sacrament at this first opportunity. If someone wishes to defer their child's reception of the sacrament that will be accommodated by our parish.

Intentions on the Sunday 10.45 Mass is for Month's Mind and 1st Anniversary Masses

The 10.45am mass each Sunday is reserved for families whose loved one's month's mind or 1st anniversary is occurring. It is important that our priority is all the time with the recently bereaved and as is the norm this is the only intention taken on these masses. Families with these anniversaries will be invited to bring forward the bread and wine at the offertory time of these masses. Up to two intentions are taken on the other Sunday morning masses (9am and 12 noon). If a person's preferred date is not available then they are asked to move the intention to the next available date. Your accommodation with ensuring good pastoral practice is appreciated.

New Anniversary Occurring Masses

Every Saturday evening vigil mass from the first Saturday in September (September 4th) mass will be offered for those whose anniversary occurs at that particular time. This mass is the main parish mass that will have multiple intentions. Family members are asked to attend and one family member will be invited to come forward at the Mass to light a candle for the deceased.

The 10am masses throughout the week from Monday to Friday will be available as single intention masses. Parishioners should contact the parish office to see what masses are available for the week they intend remembering their loved one.

Donaghmore Mass Intentions

The first mass of each month in Donaghmore is reserved for month's memory masses or 1st anniversary masses. The other Sunday masses can have a maximum of two intentions. Only in exceptional circumstances should a month's mind or 1st anniversary mass be shared and it is best practise in a parish that masses be reserved for recently deceased and bereaved. Your understanding and attention to this is important.
