Last Sunday, Bishop Tom invited all of us in the Diocese of Meath to embark on this journey together and to participate actively in this process so that we can discern together what it is that God is asking of the church at this time. Our three catholic primary schools in Ashbourne work with the parish and family home and all three are co responsible in preparing children for the sacraments.

A meeting for parents/guardians enrolled on the after school programme will take place in Ashbourne Church on Thursday evening November 4<sup>th</sup> at 8pm. The after school classes are now completely full and closed for registration until May of next year. The classes take place every Tuesday and Wednesday in the parish hall. We thank the teachers for the work that they do to support the enrolled children and parents in preparing their children for the sacraments of first confession, communion and confirmation in 2022.

## November Baptism Schedule



From the first Saturday in November baptisms will take place at 2.30pm every Saturday afternoon. Parents with a child for baptism bring their child to Sunday mass and introduce themselves after mass to one of our priests and on asking for the sacrament they receive a parish baptism request form. This is completed by the parents after watching the parish video on baptism and once it is returned to the parish office arrangements are made for the celebration of the sacrament. Restrictions on the numbers attending a baptism are lifted in our parish from the beginning of November.

## Finance Matters

The next meeting of the parish finance committee will take place on Wednesday evening November 3<sup>rd</sup>. It will take place at 7pm in the Old National School. Fr. Michael hopes to review the role of a finance committee, the 2020 Income and Expenditure report published last week, discuss the 2022 budget for music ministry and possible future capital projects. All committee members are asked to read over the briefing documents issued in recent days by email.
