Do This In Memory Mass

If anyone is sick or housebound this Christmas and would like a priest to bring them the Blessed Sacrament or administer the Sacrament of the Sick, please contact the parish office by Tuesday morning.



Christmas Ceremonies on RTE and EWTN

The 11pm RTE Mass on Christmas Eve on television is from the Cooley Peninsula and is celebrated by the Most Rev Eamon Martin, the Catholic Archbishop of Armagh. The Eurovision Mass on Christmas morning on RTE at 10am is from the French speaking canton of Switzerland. Pope Francis' Christmas message and the annual 'Urbi et Orbi' Blessing is broadcast at 11.45am on RTE. EWTN (Channel 588) will broadcast midnight Mass from Bethlehem and the solemn Christmas papal Mass from Rome.



Christmas Offering Day

Christmas is an offering day for the support of a priest in a parish. Usually the envelope and basket collection taken up at Christmas goes towards the payment of a monthly salary to Fr. Michael and Fr. Ciarán. With several of the six annual offertory collections not taking place this year and with numbers at masses restricted parishioners are asked to be as generous as they can. For those who have not got their own parish envelope number special Christmas envelopes are left in each of our churches. People unable to get to mass can return their contribution to either the safe deposit at the back of the church or drop it through the letterbox at the parish office. Gratitude is expressed to all those making a contribution. Your parish gets no state support for income lost over the last two years and we appreciate all those going out of their way to make a supportive offering at this time.
