

Renewal of Baptism Promises

This Sunday we mark the baptism of Jesus in the river Jordan. All four gospels record Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist which heralds the start of Jesus' public ministry. Jesus was thirty years of age when baptised. At mass we renew our baptismal promises and we are sprinkled with holy water as we pledge our allegiance to God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Our baptism sets us apart and calls us into union with God.

Holy Water in our parish



Regrettably, Holy water, the great sacramental linked to our baptism, is not allowed to be placed in fonts at this time when touching of surfaces that can easily get contaminated remains restricted. Holy Water is available in the metal container at the sacristy door next the cemetery in Ashbourne Church grounds. Parishioners are welcome to take holy water from this container when the church grounds are open.

Parish Baptism Guidelines

Baptisms take place in Ashbourne Church every Saturday afternoon at 2.30pm. In order to strengthen the connection of baptism with the gathering of the faith community parents introduce themselves and their new born to Fr. Michael or Fr. Ciaran after attending Sunday mass and express their desire to have their child baptised. The parents receive a 'Baptism Request Form' and information on preparing for the celebration of the sacrament. The Baptism Request Form is then completed and returned to the parish office or one of the priests. Up to four baptisms take place on any given Saturday. At least two weeks advance notice is necessary and once the form is processed the parish secretary will confirm the baby's baptism date by email or telephone. There are now no restrictions on numbers attending and everyone is welcome to the ceremony in person or online.



Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament takes place each Thursday from 10.30am to 8pm in Ashbourne Church. All are encouraged to spend some time in adoration & quiet prayer. It is a wonderful New Year's Resolution.

Yearly Statistics on Baptisms

In 2021 there were 145 baptisms in our parish. It was a challenging year for baptisms as the country including the church was in a lockdown for many months. This meant that as the country and our parish tried to reopen and live with covid there was a huge demand for baptisms in the latter part of the year. In 2020 there were 95 baptisms in Ashbourne Donaghmore parish and in 2019 there were 157 children and 4 adults.

Catholic Schools Week 2022

Catholic Schools Week takes place from 30th of January to 4th of February. During this week the catholic schools celebrate their ethos and the value system that is enshrined in their characteristic spirit. The theme for 2022 is 'Catholic Schools: Living Life to the Full'.



'Do This In Memory' Catechesis 3

Fr. Michael and Fr. Ciarán will meet with the children on the parish communion program on Tuesday morning January 11th. As part of their preparation for holy communion the children attending our parish catholic schools with their teachers attend monthly catechesis in Ashbourne Church from 10.45am to 11.20am. The catechesis will be on the Offertory gifts of bread and wine and links with the work the children will be doing at home and at school as part of their preparation. The children and their families are asked to attend weekly Sunday mass with the faith community and once a month the children are involved with the Sunday liturgy. This is the third encounter since the reopening of our churches.

Parish Program After School Sacramental Classes Resume

On Tuesday and Wednesday of this week the after school sacramental classes resume. We thank Kay, the teachers and parents for ensuring the classes run safely and smoothly.

Getting Ready for Confirmation

Confirmation in Ashbourne is now only a little more than eight weeks away. The enrolled children are busy learning about the sacrament and the Holy Spirit. Bishop Tom is due to begin confirmation in early February and is with us, God willing, on March 12. Just like in recent covid years the confirmation ceremony will be a stand-alone ceremony and the candidate and three other people are allowed attend. Candidates and families are asked to follow all of the guidelines around staying safe in church buildings and grounds. *'Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of the faithful and enkindle in us the fire of your love ...'*

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available every Saturday in Ashbourne Church from 5pm to 6pm. All are welcome to receive the sacrament and it is another good way to begin the New Year.

Coeliac or Gluten Free Hosts

Parishioners are reminded that a gluten free host is available from the priest at communion time. If you are gluten intolerant please indicate that you wish to receive this host when you come forward for communion. The pyx with these hosts is contained within the large ciboria to emphasise the oneness of all God's people around the Eucharist.

Offertory Gifts at the 11am Sunday Mass

The 11am Sunday Mass is reserved for a month's mind or first anniversary mass. Families booking the mass do so through the parish office and will be invited by Fr. Michael and Fr. Ciarán on the week of the mass to take up the offertory gifts of bread and wine. The gifts that we offer at mass are symbolic of the prayers that we offer together for the deceased. It is an important aspect of our faith that we pray for the dead and keep them alive in our hearts.



Christian Unity Week (18th-25th January)

Each year during this month Christians unite to pray and promote greater co-operation between Christians of all denominations. In the past in our country there was much emphasis on difference rather than on similarities and regrettably Christians often did not share and celebrate their common vision. We have all heard stories of how horrific these divisions were. Today thankfully Catholics, Church of Ireland members, Methodists and Presbyterians emphasize the person of Christ at the heart of their lives. On Sunday January 23rd Fr. Michael and Fr. Ciarán will offer Mass for Christian Unity.

Parish Finance Meeting
