After School Sacramental Classes 2023-2024



Enrolment by Catholic parents of their children in after school parish classes for the next academic year begins this week. Fr. Michael, Fr. Ciarán and Kay Churm, the Parish Co-

ordinator, will hold a meeting for all interested parents in Ashbourne Church at 8pm on Tuesday evening next, April 25th. Registration Forms for the Sacraments of First Confession, Communion and Confirmation will be available that night. Places in the classes are given on a first come first served basis and completed forms should be returned to the parish office before the end of May. A two year program of catechesis takes place both for the sacrament of Holy Communion and Confirmation following Church requirements. For ten years the parish has run these classes and is grateful to Kay, the Catechists and parents who work with the priests in providing this opportunity to pass on the faith to children.

Anointing with New Easter Oil

The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will be part of the 10am daily Mass Tuesday morning next, April 25th, the Feast of St. Mark. Every two months our parish offers the opportunity for



parishioners to receive this sacrament. This will be the first time the new oil of holy anointing will be used in our parish since it was blessed by Bishop Tom at the Chrism Mass on Wednesday of Holy Week. As followers of Jesus, we recall how Jesus was close to the sick and as Christians we always pray for those who are sick, infirm and in need of physical, mental or spiritual healing.
