

The Good Shepherd Image



One of the great images of Easter is Jesus as the Good Shepherd. The early Christians in the catacomb graves of Rome carved images of the Good Shepherd on stone expressing belief in the resurrection. Today's gospel emphasises the

relationship between sheep and their shepherd. Just as sheep learn to trust the sound of their shepherd's voice, the followers of Jesus listen to His voice speaking to them and follow Him to new pasture.

First Holy Communion

Next Saturday there are four first holy communion ceremonies in our parish for the children prepared though St.

welcomed and flowers placed around a picture or statue of Mary. As part of the 10am Mass in Donaghmore this Sunday there is a blessing of the countryside. As part of the 10am Mass on Monday a crown is placed on our Lady's statue. The children in Senior Infants in our parish schools are being introduced to the Hail Mary and on the last weekend of May will join us at Sunday Mass to lead us in praying this great prayer of our Church.

Celebrating St Dympna

A beautiful stained glass window behind the altar in Ashbourne Church depicts St. Dympna. Two excursions from our parish are being planned in the coming weeks to highlight our link with St. Dympna. A bus will leave the grounds of Ashbourne Church at 12 noon on Monday, May 15th, (her feast day) to travel to the National Gallery to view the Belgian altarpiece featuring



various scenes from Dympna's life. Up to parishioners are allowed access to this temporary exhibition and the only cost is the price of the bus fare which is €15. At 2pm on Thursday, May 18th a group of fifteen parishioners have been granted permission by the National Museum of Ireland to privately see and learn about the relic called bachall Dhamhnaid (Dympna's staff). If you are interested in coming along and are able to meet us at 2pm at the Kildare Street entrance (next the Dáil) please let us know. Entrance is free but limited to a small group. Both trips should be booked through the parish office or with Fr. Michael or Fr. Ciarán.
