




Prayer for Fr. Ciarán and all Priests

# Feast of Saints Peter and Paul

Thursday next, June 29th, is the feast of St. Peter and Paul. These are two of the great saints of the church. They lived at the time of Jesus and were witnesses to His resurrection. Peter was the first Pope and he led the church from Jerusalem primarily looking after Jews who became followers of Jesus. Paul got his name after his conversion on the road to Damascus and he travelled across the Mediterrean

world bringing the Christian message to the pagan Gentiles. Both saints died as martyr's in Rome and when people go to Rome they visit their graves and learn about these two sinners who became saints.
