

Donaghmore Roof Extension

The roof on the extension of Donaghmore Church has been letting in water and weakening through damp as the years go by. As a result the bathroom has been closed for several weeks.



Work to rectify the roof began in recent days and parishioners will see scaffolding being put in place around the damaged roof. The works are costing just under €21,000 and will take about three weeks to complete. The monies received through the generosity of parishioner's using the envelope collection and standing orders are making this investment possible. The faith community of Donaghmore is grateful to those who support them in looking after this ancient protected structure—one of three the parish manages in its efforts to build the kingdom of God in our parish.

Date for Confirmation 2024

Bishop Tom Deenihan released in recent days his schedule of Confirmation Ceremonies for 2024. With the help of God, Bishop Tom will visit our parish on Saturday March

23rd. Parents will have the opportunity to request the sacrament for their child in September when the parish schools and after school parish classes are up and running again after the summer break.



Tax Rebate Letters on Parishioner's Contributions
