Update on Parochial House Works

Works continue on the Parochial House this summer. The house is now

sealed with the new doors and windows in place. The walls at the moment are being straightened and strengthened. The external insulation will then be put in place. At the moment it is hoped that the works on the house and adjoining boiler house and store will be complete by the end of October. Fr. Michael will move in to the house when it is finished. Fr. Jim Lynch, Ashbourne's second parish priest, was the last parish priest to live beside the church. The Parochial house was erected when the extension was added to Ashbourne Church in 1982.

As part of Mass next weekend we ask grandchildren and grandparent's to come to Mass together. At Mass prayers will be offered in thanksgiving for Catholic grandparents who help parents instruct children about Jesus.

At the end of Masses next Sunday grandparent's with their grandchildren alongside are invited to come forward to the altar to receive a blessing. A gift from the parish for each child with a grandparent will be presented.

Re-Introducing the Ministry of Mass Server in Ashbourne and Donaghmore

Are you in 3rd, 4th, 5th or 6th class, go to Mass regularly and would like to become a Mass Server in September? Consent Form's are now available from our Priests after Mass. Mass Servers would be for weekend masses in our churches and parents and child commit



to a particular mass—one they normally attend on a Saturday evening or Sunday morning. Parish Training will be provided to the boys and girls and the server's vestments provided. Fr. Michael and the priests of the parish will meet with parents before the serving begins to explain all involved including code of conduct, safeguarding supervision etc. Completed Parental and Child Consent Forms should be returned to the Parish Office before the end of August. If anyone has any questions or seek clarification on any matter please speak to one of our priests or contact the parish office. We look forward to getting children involved again in this important ministry.

Visit of Viatores Christi to our Parish

Next weekend members of a catholic voluntary group called 'Viatores Christi' will speak at Masses in our parish during the Saturday Vigil and the Sunday Masses.

What is Viatores Christi? Viatores Christi (VC) is an association of Catholic lay missionary/development workers, founded in 1960. VC brings about positive change by improving access to healthcare, education and livelihood opportunities in the marginalised communities in which they work.

To thank the people of the Meath Diocese for your support for our work over the years. To offer an opportunity and preparation to anyone who feels called to volunteer.
