Pope Francis opened the Synod of Bishops in Rome on Wednesday. He has gathered church representatives from around the world to converse with him on church matters. The Irish delegation as they left for the eternal city reiterated that the synodal process is about con-



version. They asked people attending daily and weekend masses, at home and in religious communities to pray for Pope Francis and for all members of the Synodal Assembly as they reflect on and discuss the work of reform and renewal of the church. In the words of our Holy Father 'without prayer there will be no Synod'.

Reflecting on the Call to Mission


