

World Mission Sunday

Next weekend we celebrate Mission Sunday. Our Masses will be offered for the Evangelisation of People. There are two aspects to Mission— Near and Far.



Every Christian is a missionary. We are tasked with mission through our baptism to spread and share the good news of Jesus Christ. Many people around us have not experienced Jesus. They do not have a real relationship with the Lord and

doubt him as a friend. Some are lapsed in their belief and some are three generations gone from a living faith. Meath diocese relies currently on 21 Priests from the developing world. These priests are from Nigeria, Romania, Uganda and India. We have a long history of sending missionaries abroad and now we need missionary priests and sisters to help us live our faith and grow in our love of God.

Alongside the mission to build the kingdom of God in our own locality we are encouraged to always support the foreign missions. The church is young and growing in several parts of



the world. Irish missionary nuns and priests contributed much to bringing Jesus to the wider world. We support our brothers and sisters in Christ through prayer and finance. 'Missio Ireland' is the Pope's official charity which organises the annual Irish church appeal to support overseas mission and missionaries. As over 1,100 young dioceses grow, so do their needs. They are often found in remote areas challenged by conflict, persecution and natural disasters. The reflection and prayer offered at this time supports and encourages the young churches. The money we collect at Mass next weekend goes towards supporting missionary programmes to provide basic infrastructure, train future leaders in the church and care for the spiritual and physical wellbeing of children and adults. Over €1.3 million was collected on Mission Sunday last year and supported projects in the Central African Republic, Guinea-Bissau, Mali and Niger.

During the month of October you are encouraged to pray the Rosary for missionary activity in the world. Offer the first decade for the Church in the continent of **Europe**, so that it might be capable of getting back its evangelising strength



which generated several churches. Pray the second decade for Asia, which explodes with life and youthfulness. Meditate and reflect on the third decade for Africa, tested by suffering, but open to the announcement of the Gospel. In the fourth decade pray for America, the nursery of new missionary strength. Offer the last decade for the Continent of Oceania and Australia which is awaiting greater diffusion of the Gospel.

First Task of the New Parish Assembly

The first task of the new parish pastoral assembly is to put together a parish mission statement. Fr. Derek, the diocesan support person for pastoral activity, briefed the members of the assembly at its recent training day on some of the aspects of formulating a good mission statement. The



new assembly will meet in November to look at this issue and will publish its mission statement once agreed. The assembly will be officially commissioned at the 11am mass on Sunday December 3. The assembly will have a four year term and work on the four pastoral areas prioritised from the parish survey.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults Has Begun



This year's Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults wanting to become a Catholic is underway. Two candidates have begun the journey of adult reception of the Catholic sacraments. We thank Brendan and Áine for running the classes every Saturday morning in the Parish Centre. We look forward to

welcoming the candidates to Sunday Mass as we accompany them in their journey of faith and reception of the sacraments next Easter and Pentecost.

Safeguarding Sunday

On Sunday 5 November our parish will celebrate Safeguarding Sunday. Now that we have children back serving mass it is important that we are vigilant around child safety and do everything to continue to make sure that the



environment for children's ministry is safe and child friendly. On this first Sunday of November our parish will highlight its safeguarding policy and standards. Our child safeguarding representatives are Mary Mullen and Michelle Heneghan and two new safeguarding representatives are in the process of receiving training. We thank these volunteers for the time they give to supporting children's activities in our parish.

Sale of Parish House in Johnswood Park



In the last few days the Property Commission of St. Finian's Diocesan Trust informed our parish that the mid terrace townhouse in Johnswood estate belonging to our parish was sold. The

parish finance committee took the decision to sell the house last February as a number of projects were to be financed in our parish and the missionary outreach of the house had come to an end in recent years.
