Hail, Redeemer, Christ Divine


This Final Sunday of the Liturgical Year is Christ the King Sunday and a Feast Day that focusses on the Supreme Authority of Christ.

Last week Bishop Tom met with the priests of the 69 parishes of our diocese. He began a process of reflection on the future of priestly ministry and pastoral life in parishes in the Diocese of Meath. At this gathering, new models of parish

life, possible future collaborations among parishes, the provision of sacraments, personnel and resources, faith formation and the welfare of priests were discussed. The establishment of a Parish Pastoral Assembly in every parish to help diocesan consultation and engagement was reemphasised. While there are no simple solutions to the challenges of keeping faith alive and sustaining vibrant faith communities in the future context it is important that we engage in the reality of the world of today and pray that the Holy Spirit will guide us in the tasks ahead.



Pope Francis travels to Dubai in the United Arab Emirates on Friday to participate in COP

28. This Annual UN Climate Summit will assess progress and failures in reaching the goals adopted by 196 countries, including the Holy See, at the Paris climate agreement in 2015. Pope Francis often speaks of the need for everyone to look after the environment and all of God's creation and he has written two encyclical letters to Catholics on this topic.

Today is the Feast of Christ the King. On the last Sunday of the Year we celebrate that Jesus is the Universal King and His Kingdom is supreme above all others. We reflect on the fact that as Jesus' followers we must build the kingdom here on earth and look forward always to the kingdom of heaven when we die. Our diocese



especially celebrates this feast as our Cathedral in Mullingar was the first church in the world to have the honour of this title. 40 Hours of Adoration ends at 4pm in the Cathedral today with Bishop Tom leading Benediction in honour of Christ the King.



Next Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent, marks a new calendar year in the Christian liturgical world. The four Sundays of the Advent season encourage Christians to prepare spiritually for the arrival of the Christ child. The advent wreath

is used in our churches and schools to help us focus on the impending birth of our Lord. In this coming year the readings of Cycle B in the liturgical calendar will be read at Sunday Masses,

The Child Safeguarding Committee met on Tuesday last. The priests and parish safeguarding representatives read through the latest documents from the diocese, discussed the involvement of children in parish



activities and they completed the annual audit of safeguarding matters pertaining to our parish. The parish thanks all children and parents for their involvement in church related activities primarily in after school classes and serving Sunday Mass.



Now that the refurbishment of the Parochial House is complete attention focuses on getting the external works around the house and church complete by the end of the year. Part of the works necessitated is the removal of

overhead wires in the church grounds and the provision of new ducting underground for electricity, water and broadband.

Now that we have heat in Ashbourne church again it is important that we conserve heat in the church for our liturgies and people entering our church to pray. Parishioners are asked



to close the exterior doors after them at all times. Only those authorised should put the doors into full open mode. This happens when a crowd are entering or exiting at the one time. During the days of co-vid it was necessary to have doors open to let air circulate. Now we need to conserve heat and work towards having warm churches and warm hearts!
