




On Saturday the 18th & 25th of May children will receive Holy communion with their families as guests of honour at the Sunday Mass the next day. 1st Confession: From 4 to 6pm on Saturdays of Lent parents bring their children to the sacrament. In Ashbourne parish confession is received for the first time a year before Holy Eucharist.



All sacraments for children or minors must be requested by a parent or next of kin taking responsibility for the handing on of faith. If you are a parent who wish to prepare your child for baptism,

confession, communion or confirmation you are reminded that your child must be registered with the Parish Office. Just because a child is in a certain class in a school presumption of a sacrament is made without parental never consent and commitment to the Christian faith.






Catholic Schools Week 2024 Catholic Schools: Serving Our Communities

Christian Unity Week Begins on Thursday


OO THIS IN MEMORL

Parish Pastoral Assembly

The Parish Parish Assembly had its first meeting on Tuesday evening last. Members are getting to know one another and are beginning their work of looking at the four pastoral needs

that they are tasked with over the coming years. Charles Bobbett is the Chairperson for the first six months and Sinead Carroll is the secretary to the assembly for the first year. A different member of the group leads prayer at each gathering. The meeting follows the model of 'See, Judge and Act' in terms of discerning the promptings of the Holy Spirit and building consensus among members. This initial meeting began looking at ways we can improve the parish website and promoting parish masses and a living faith.

2024 Month's Memory and 1st Anniversary Masses

Our parish has one intention on our weekday and Sunday morning Masses. Our shared Mass for deceased loved ones with an anniversary occurring is on a Saturday evening at 7pm at which



a candle is lit for each intention of the families gathered. The 11am Mass and two of the 12.30pm Masses each month are reserved for families booking a Month's Memory or First Anniversary Mass for their loved one. We kindly remind parishioners to understand that our secretary, Mary, tries her best to facilitate the wishes of families but a person's first choice is not always available. Parishioners are encouraged to book all Anniversary Masses through the Parish Office at an early opportunity, to be flexible in terms of dates (particularly on a Sunday) and families should liaise to avoid the same intention occurring twice in the Parish Diary. The stipend for the Mass being offered should be paid to Mary at the time of booking through the Parish Office. The priest who says the Mass receives this donation. Be assured if any person wishes to have a Mass said and cannot afford a stipend, the priests of our parish are happy to oblige.
