






create God's people.

The third of the four preparatory masses for confirmation takes place in Ashbourne Church next weekend. The sacrament will be conferred by Bishop Tom on Saturday March 23. As part of the rite the children will receive a saint's name that they themselves have chosen. For Masses next Sunday the

children will have completed a project on their chosen saint and they will bring to Mass their saint's card that will be used in the confirmation ceremony.

to the Diaconate in Saint Mary's Church in Drogheda at 7pm. A native of Navan, Anthony is currently on Pastoral Placement in Drogheda. Anthony will be ordained to the Priesthood next year. Financial Matters in Our Parish



The envelope boxes that support the Parish Development Fund will be ready on Monday week. The new envelope year begins on the first Sunday of February. We ask parishioners to call in to the Parish Office to collect their box and where possible to help with their distribution in their local area.

The first 2024 meeting of the Parish Finance Committee will take place on Tuesday evening January 23 at 6pm in the Parish Centre. Preparations are currently being made for release of the Parish Financial and Development Report for 2023-2024 on the first weekend of February.

After Holy Communion next Sunday there will be a second collection for our parish contribution towards the Diocesan Cess. The money collected across parishes in the Diocese of Meath will support the work of our church welfare agencies including Accord Catholic Marriage Care, the National Child Safeguarding Board, and the Council for Immigrant and Emigrant Support. This is one of six second collections that take place annually in our parish.

Last Sunday's Collection Totals Plate €1360.00; Shrines €905.00; Development Fund €1445.00.

The priests of the parish are most grateful to all those who give to their parish. We thank parishioners for their support and the stewards and counters who help with the various collections in our churches. Your help is greatly appreciated.
