Christmas Masses begin this evening at 5pm and continue until the last mass at 12.30pm on Christmas Day. Our full schedule is Ashbourne 5pm, 7pm and 7pm Donaghmore. On Monday Christmas Masses in Ashbourne are at 9am, 11am and 12.30pm. Donaghmore has Mass Christmas morning at 10am. We encourage parishioners to attend Mass for Christmas and to reflect on the great mystery of the Christ child. Children are encouraged to bring birthday cards for baby Jesus. Everyone is encouraged to sing the carols and put their heart and mind into celebrating the great mystery of the Incardination.

There will be mass and a priest on duty every day in our parish over the coming days of Christmas. The celebration of daily Eucharist will be as usual at 10am starting with mass on St. Stephen's morning at 10am. Mass on Wednesday the 27th is offered on the feast of St. John the Apostle for Jack and Kathleen Moore. On Thursday December 28th we recall the massacre of the Holy Innocents and mass in our parish is for Vinny Beggy. Friday 29th is the feast of St. Thomas Beckett and the 10am Mass is for Terry O'Brien. On Saturday evening Decem-

ber 30th Mass at 7pm is a Shared mass offered for the repose of the following souls Noel Rock; Kathleen & William, Maureen and James Maloney, Jim, Mary and Tom Stenson, Jane Kellegher, Patrick Simpson, Joe Cunnane. Masses in Ashbourne and Donaghmore next Sunday are at the normal times of 9am, 10am (D), 11am and 12.30pmm. They are offered for the People of the Parish as the curtain falls on 2023.

#### New Year's Day Mass




