

Confirming Our Children—Mass Number 3

The third of the four preparatory masses for the sacrament of confirmation takes place in Ashbourne Church this weekend. As part of the confirmation rite with Bishop Tom the children take on a saint's name. This is a name that the children have themselves chosen. For Masses this Sunday the children have completed a project on their chosen saint's name. To link in with the work of the children and raise awareness of the call for all of us to be saint's we have a 'Litany of the Saints' and Blessing of the 'Confirmandi' after communion. Each child is asked to bring their saint's name printed in a large font on an A4 sheet and to hold it aloft to show it to the congregation at the appointed time.

Confirmation begins in Meath Diocese

Confirmation in Ashbourne is now eight weeks away. The children are busy learning about the sacrament and reflecting on the Holy Spirit. Bishop Tom began confirmation last week in Trim and is with our faith community, God willing, on Saturday, March 23. The confirmation ceremony will again this year be a stand-

alone ceremony at which each candidate, their sponsor and two other people attend. There will be a ceremony at 12 noon and one at 3pm with each seat being used in our church to accommodate the 186 'confirmandi'. Candidates and families are asked to follow all of the guidelines around keeping these important ceremonies prayerful and joyful. "Come Holy Spirit:..."







St. Brigid's Day February 1st Thursday 10am Mass

St. Brigid's Day is on Thursday and for many it heralds the beginning of the

Irish spring and turning a back on winter. St. Brigid is the female patron saint of Ireland. She is also known as 'Muire na Gael' or 'Our Lady of the Irish'. Her image is now on Our Lady's altar as we reflect on her simple life of faith and generosity. It is welcome news that the government now has the first Monday in February each year as a public holiday. Many people had lobbied for this great woman to continue to be acknowledged for the role she played as a pioneer in bringing the flame of faith to many parts of our country. There is a strong tradition of children and adults in our parish making St. Brigid's crosses for her feast day. Mass with Blessing of the Crosses is at 10am.

Candlemas Day – Friday

On February 2nd candles are blessed at the 10am daily Mass as Christians celebrate 40 days since Christmas Day with the marking of the feast of Jesus' presentation in the temple. Our church candles will be blessed on Friday during



the liturgy and if anyone has candles of their own they would like blessed please bring them to mass on this day. The parish is grateful to Ollie, aka 'the candle man' who as a volunteer diligently looks after candles and shrines in Ashbourne church. The feast of Jesus' presentation is also a day of prayer for those in religious life.

Feast of St Blaise – Saturday



Saturday is the Feast of St Blaise and the Vigil Mass on Saturday evening next will conclude with the blessing of throats. Alternatively you can visit Ashbourne church on that afternoon from 5 to 6pm when a priest is available. St. Blaise was an early bishop and martyr of the

church and is venerated as the patron of those suffering from throat disease. His remains are in Dubrovnik in Croatia where throats are blessed every day of the year.

Monthly List of the Dead Mass and Calls to the Sick

Friday next is the First Friday in February. The 10am Mass will be offered for those enrolled on the Ashbourne-Donaghmore Altar List of the Dead. Our priests will do communion calls to those on the parish list also on



this day. If anyone is at home and cannot get to mass and wish to receive the sacrament they should contact the parish.

Synod Update

In October 2021, Pope Francis announced a Universal Synod on the theme of synodality. Its official title is 'For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission.' Following two years of preparation, listening and dialogue at parish, diocesan and universal level, more than 360 people gathered in Rome last October for its first session. Bishop Brendan Leahy from the Diocese of Limerick and Bishop Alan McGuckian from the Diocese of Raphoe were the two bishop nominees of the Irish Catholic Bishops'
