Parents have taken the opportunity to request the sacrament for their child. The sacrament of reconciliation is about responding to God's love and being able to forgive and say sorry for our faults and failings. Parents are asked to continue bringing their child to confession at least once a year. Parents bringing their child to confession should consider going to confession themselves. It is as always voluntary but children learn from example in the home. We hope that all the children receiving the sacrament for the first time will always know and celebrate God's love.

The Lenten billboards are now displayed to remind people passing our Church of the Lenten season. Our churches have a Lenten desert scene to encourage parishioners to enter into the journey and awakening of Lent. Purple is the traditional colour of Lent and our priests wear purple vestments at most liturgies over the next 40 days. Purple represents the call to renew our lives spiritually, and to reflect on what it is that Christ achieved for us through his passion and death. During this season the Alleluia and Gloria are no longer said or sung at Mass and flowers on the sanctuary are kept at a minimum. This is all part of us 'stripping ourselves' back to the essentials and 'entering the desert' of Lent.



Did you know that the Stations of the Cross go back to the early Christians. When war prevented medieval pilgrims from visiting the actual sites in

Jerusalem, artists created images representing these events so the faithful could express their devotion. The Franciscans spread this practice in the twelfth century and erected small chapels highlighting the different steps of Jesus' sorrowful journey. Since 1731 the stations have numbered 14 and they have been promoted especially during Lent and on Fridays. An extra 15th station was put up in Ashbourne church when the stations were erected on its walls in 1981. You are encouraged this Lent to do the stations. Reflections under each station in Ashbourne Church help us to enter into each scene. On the Friday evenings of Lent there are public stations at 6pm and 7pm. The 6pm stations are in Indian and the 7pm stations in English. All are welcome.

Trocáire Boxes and envelopes are available again this Sunday in our churches. This year's giving campaign aims to support the people of Malawi. Trocáire and the Lenten institution of the Trocáire Box celebrates 51 years this year. In 1973 the charity was founded by the Irish church to help provide aid to poor people in the developing world.

overhead wires are now gone to ground as required by planning permission for works on the Parochial House and Old National School.

Accounts Handed Over



Fr. Michael handed over the accounts of our parish to the diocesan accountant last week. All of the 2023 receipts and lodgements of our parish were given in electronic and paper

format. These are now processed and the official 'Income and Expenditure Sheet' will be presented to the parish in April once the accountancy firm has their work done. Our parish accounts makes up one 69th of the audited accounts of the charity that we belong to called 'St.
