

#### **Our Schools are Promoting Lent**



#### Fr. Michael Elected Chair of the Council of Priests

Fr. Michael was elected on Monday by his brother priests to lead the Council of Priests in the Diocese of Meath. The Council of Priests is a consultative forum among priests in dialogue with their bishop. Topics will range from the ongoing care of priests, evangelisation, strengthening of lay leadership, celebration



of the sacraments, and all aspects of priestly ministry. Please God the Holy Spirit will guide him as he takes on this new role. We pray for him and all the priests of the diocese as a new Council is put in place for a term of five years.

#### Feedback from Synod in Rome

The Meath Diocesan Synodal Team are hosting a meeting in Ashbourne on Wednesday week to offer feedback on the Synod which was held in Rome last October. We hope that parishioners will come along and engage with the process which will inform the preparations for the conclusion of the Synod in Rome next October. The gathering will last 90 minutes and take place in our Parish Centre. It would be helpful to have some familiarity with the document issued following the Synod last October called Towards the 2024 Assembly available on www.synod.va. All parishioners are

Synode 2021 2024 invited to hear what is being planned, and to have their say on the Irish response to the first part of Pope Francis initiative. We hope that Ashbourne will be able to organise a cup of tea for those attending. If you can help with the simple catering please let us know.

#### **New Location Of Water Tap in the Parish Cemetery**

The water tap in Ashbourne Church grounds has been relocated to the wall between the Cemetery and the Parish Centre. Hopefully this will work as a good location for the tap. It saves people having to walk on the grass. It is more central for parishioners and it moves the water ducting away from where the



electrical port, and ducting has been placed as part of the ongoing ducting upgrade to Ashbourne Church campus.

#### . Collections at the Gates of our Churches



Church Gate Collections do not fall within the remit of our parish. We do not authorise the collections and the State lays down the conditions under which a collection can take place. Anyone collecting with a state permit must collect outside the church gates. No one should be collecting on church property. It has

been brought to the priest's attention in recent months that people are breaching the state protocols by entering the church grounds and occasions have even entered the church.
