

Highlighting St Joseph on His Feast Day



On Tuesday we celebrate the Feast of St. Joseph. A statue of 'Sleeping St. Joseph' made famous by Pope Francis is on display in Ashbourne Church. It depicts St. Joseph asleep as it was very often in his dreams that Joseph was guided by God.

"I would like to tell you something very personal. I have a great love for St. Joseph because he is a man of silence and strength. On my table I have a statue of St. Joseph sleeping. Even when he is asleep he is taking care of the church. Yes, we know he can do that. So when I have a problem, a difficulty, I write a little note and I put it underneath St. Joseph so that he can dream about it. In other words, I tell him, pray fror this problem". Pope Francis

Registration of Donaghmore Church

Holy Week Schedule



Palm Sunday Masses in Ashbourne and Donaghmore Churches are as on a regular Sunday. Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Last supper is at 8pm in the Church of the Immaculate Conception. Good Friday Morning Prayer and Veneration of the Cross is

in Donaghmore Church at 10am. Outdoor Way of the Cross will take place at 12 noon in Ashbourne Church grounds; Veneration of the Cross and Liturgy of the Lord's Passion is at 3pm in Ashbourne Church. Both our Churches will be open on Good Friday for people to visit and reflect on Jesus' death. Our Holy Saturday Vigil Mass is at 9pm; Easter Sunday Masses will celebrate what the resurrection means and are at 9am, 11am and 12.30pm in Ashbourne Church. Donaghmore Church will have Easter morning Mass at 10am.

Diocesan Chrism Mass

Chrism Mass in the Cathedral in Mullingar will take place on Wednesday of Holy Week at 7pm. You are invited to this diocesan gathering at which the



priests of Meath diocese renew their vows. Bishop Tom will lead the Eucharistic celebration and in his homily outline his vision for the diocese. The oils are blessed that priests use in parishes over the coming year. On this day in particular we pray for our bishop and priests as they serve the Lord in the 69 parishes of our diocese.
