priesthood and religious life. We reflect on Jesus as the Good Shepherd and the call to pastoral ministry. We pray and support all good priests in ministry across our diocese and ask the Lord for a deepening of the fundamental vocation we all share in following Christ, the Good Shepherd.

The Good Shepherd Image

One of the great images of Easter is Jesus as the Good Shepherd. The early Christians in the catacomb graves of Rome carved images of the Good Shepherd on stone belief in expressing the



resurrection. Today's gospel emphasises relationship between sheep and their shepherd. Just as sheep learn to trust the sound of their shepherd's voice, the followers of Jesus listen to His voice speaking to them and follow Him to new pasture.

After School Sacramental Classes 2024-2025

Anointing with New Easter Oil

The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will be part of the 10am daily Mass on the last day of the month, Tuesday morning, April 30th. Every two months our parish offers the opportunity for parishioners to receive this sacrament. This will be the first time the new oil of holy anointing will be used in our parish since it was blessed by Bishop Tom at the

Chrism Mass on Wednesday of Holy Week. As followers of Jesus, we recall how Jesus was close to the sick, and as Christians we always pray for those who are sick, infirm and in need of physical, mental or spiritual healing.
